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Executive Summary

Infinity Church demonstrates a vibrant and spiritually engaged church culture, particularly in worship, discipleship, safeguarding, diversity, and leadership trust. Respondents consistently express strong confidence in God's activity within their lives, a deep desire for Jesus to remain central, and high levels of trust in church leadership.

This is a snapshot of the full report; whilst helpful, the full report should be read in full.

Several developmental themes also emerge throughout the report. These include strengthening assimilation and belonging, creating clearer pathways for discipleship and service, increasing local mission engagement, and responding pastorally to financial and well-being pressures experienced by a predominantly working-age congregation.

The Top 3 Strategic Priorities

1 - Strengthening Assimilation and Community Connection

While many respondents feel part of the church community, a significant number indicate limited relational connections and accountable relationships within church life.

2 - Increasing Service and Local Community Engagement

Respondents demonstrate willingness to serve but appear constrained by limited opportunities, time pressures, and unclear pathways into local mission and volunteering.

3 - Creating Clearer Discipleship and Purpose Pathways

Many respondents desire spiritual growth but appear less clear regarding next steps, calling, purpose, and practical activation within church life.

Action Plan Overview

1 - Assimilation and Belonging

- Develop stronger small-group pathways.
- Increase social and relational connection opportunities.
- Strengthen accountability and discipleship communities.

2 - Service and Outreach

- Create more visible serving opportunities.
- Expand local mission partnerships and projects.
- Promote volunteer stories and engagement pathways.

3 - Discipleship and Purpose

- Clarify spiritual growth pathways.
- Provide teaching on calling, gifting, and purpose.
- Develop mentoring and next-step discipleship structures.

4 - Well-being Support

- Provide pastoral support and care pathways.
- Offer practical teaching around finances and well-being.
- Develop support groups and targeted care initiatives.

KMI Overview

Discipleship – 5.1

Strong Bible engagement, prayer culture, and evidence of spiritual growth across the congregation.

Worship – 5.4

Respondents consistently report strong intimacy with God and meaningful worship experiences.

Assimilation – 4.3

Many respondents feel connected to the church community, though opportunities remain to strengthen belonging and accountable relationships.

Evangelism – 4.8

Strong global mission engagement with opportunities to strengthen local mission and personal faith-sharing confidence.

Service – 3.7

Respondents show willingness to serve, but opportunities and activation pathways appear underdeveloped.

Well-being

Respondents generally demonstrate positive physical and mental well-being. However, financial concerns, mental health pressures, and uncertainty around personal purpose remain important pastoral considerations.

- 12% of respondents scored physical well-being below 3.
- 13% scored mental well-being below 3.

Leadership / Volunteers

The leadership culture within Infinity Church appears healthy, supportive, and trust-based. Respondents report strong trust between leaders and positive leadership support structures.

- Strengthen leadership training pathways.
- Continue investing in younger leaders.
- Expand volunteer mobilisation and serving visibility.

Church Experience

Respondents demonstrate high levels of trust in leadership, strong attendance consistency, and highly positive worship experiences. The church also receives exceptionally high recommendation scores from attendees.

Demographics

Infinity Church demonstrates a youthful and diverse demographic profile, with Millennials and Generation Z forming the largest respondent groups. The church also reflects strong ethnic diversity and high educational attainment.

Diversity

Respondents perceive Infinity Church as highly positive regarding both gender and racial diversity, reflecting a strong culture of inclusion.

Safeguarding

Safeguarding is one of the strongest areas in the report, with exceptionally high levels of respondents' confidence in safety and protection. **There are, however, two outliers in the red zone.**

This report is based on responses gathered through the Healthy Church Pulse Survey and analysed through a combination of software-generated analytics, consultant review, and AI-supported insight.

Final Comments

Infinity Church demonstrates many healthy foundations, particularly in worship, discipleship, diversity, safeguarding, and leadership culture. The developmental themes identified are primarily strategic opportunities to strengthen assimilation, service pathways, and outward engagement, rather than corrective concerns.
